Rep. Carbajal Celebrates Educational Partnership Agreement

Congressman Salud Carbajal and Cal Poly leaders celebrated the cutting-edge aviation research that aerospace faculty and students are conducting at San Luis Obispo Regional Airport, Carbaial joined a tour and ribbon cutting at the university's ground station on April 11. The event, held at Cal Poly's hangar at the San Luis Obispo County Regional Airport, follows a \$5 million federal grant as part of the university's educational partnership agreement with the Air Force Research Laboratory (AFRL) that allows engineering students to conduct research on a general aviation airplane that is being modified to fly as an unmanned aerial vehicle, or UAV. President Armstrong, College of Engineering Dean Amy S. Fleischer and Carbajal spoke to a group of dignitaries and project manager Paulo Iscold. Later, student researchers at the hangar facility provided a tour of the facility and the UAV. "We're honored," Fleischer said, "that our elected officials and the Air Force Research Lab recognize and acknowledge the incredible things our students and faculty do.
