men and non-binary people prefer the term chest cancer. Risk factors include being a woman, age, smoking, obesity, drinking alcohol and lack of regular exercise. Symptoms vary, and sometimes there are no symptoms. Black women are more likely to die from breast cancer than women of other ethnic/racial groups. To promote early detection, conduct monthly self-exams and get an annual screening by your health care provider. It is important to know your body so talk with a medical provider if something changes. All Cal Poly health plans include breast/chest screenings.
