The shuttle runs every 30-45 minutes and offers pick-up and drop-off at seven stops, including poultry, dairy, wine and viticulture and Poly Canyon Village. Faculty and staff just need to show their Poly Card to ride. Riders can download the free Mustang Shuttle mobile app from the Apple Store or Google Play.
