#### Cal Poly Announces Temporary Kennedy Library Locations During Transformation Project

Cal Poly has announced the temporary locations for its library services and study spaces while the Kennedy Library building closes for a planned two-year transformation project. The building is scheduled to close for renovation in summer 2023, with reopening slated for fall 2025. While the library building is closed, the services and programs provided by the library will continue in other locations on campus. Built in 1980, Kennedy Library is over 40 years old and needs significant system upgrades. To ensure the safety of the campus community and construction partners, the building will be closed during the entirety of construction. The library renovation team, working closely with partners from across the university, has identified service and student study hub locations. ## **Civil Engineering Professor to Talk on Deadly Quakes in Turkey March 8**

A professor who has studied earthquakes for over 20 years knew he needed to get on the ground in Turkey to collect data — and find answers — in the aftermath of one of the deadliest quakes in a decade. Robb Moss from the Civil and Environmental Engineering Department is on the steering committee for a volunteer organization of geotechnical researchers that deployed him days after the Feb. 6 earthquakes of 7.8 and 7.5 magnitude. The temblors flattened buildings and killed more than 47,000 people across southern Turkey and northern Syria. Moss will share details of his reconnaissance, along with the implications for Turkey and the broader seismic community, during a presentation from 6:40-8 p.m. Wednesday, March 8, in the Advanced Technology Laboratories (No. 7).

## **Beef Barn to be Demolished to Make Way for Student Employee Housing**

The dilapidated beef barn, including the barn, surrounding pipe stalls and hay barn, located above the parking lots on Via Carta, will be demolished in the coming weeks to make way for new agriculture student employee housing adjacent to the planned future Animal Health Center. The site has been largely unused for several years as beef operations have relocated to other, newer sites within the College of Agriculture, Food and Environmental Sciences. The site has deteriorated, making it unusable and a potential safety concern if left unattended. Demolition of the beef pavilion is the first step prior to building two new six-bedroom student houses that will provide housing for up to 12 students working on campus agriculture sites. Agriculture housing offers a unique opportunity for qualified students to gain practical experience working in positions of responsibility at campus agricultural production units. In the past, the site was used for livestock events throughout the year, including FFA state finals, camps and other programs, which have long been held elsewhere on campus.
