Work is underway to rebuild the 3,200-acre facility in Santa Cruz County, following the 2020 CZU Lighting Complex Fire that destroyed much of the ranch’s infrastructure. The session is open to the campus community and will be an opportunity to learn of their efforts, ask questions and provide input to ongoing planning efforts.
