Cal Poly has been recognized as a Top Producer of Fulbright U.S. Scholars by the U.S. Department of State's Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs. This marks the fifth time in the last decade that Cal Poly has received this distinction. For the 2024-25 academic year, three faculty members were selected: Paul Anderson (computer science) for his research on Al applications for chronic pain in Spain, Jean Davidson (biological sciences) for advancing bioinformatics research in Iceland, and Sara Lopus (social sciences) for her research on how household compositional conditions may impact positive outcomes in children's education in Brazil. Their work supports Cal Poly's Learn by Doing philosophy while fostering global collaboration.

The site work for future housing buildings A and B is taking shape. Crews have excavated and graded the land and are building retaining walls. Utility tie-ins are also underway. FullStack Modular mobilized its new Southern California factory for the project and is fabricating modular "suite-style" dorm rooms for a stacked high-rise installation. Building A is anticipated to open in fall 2026 to more than 400 students. The design of subsequent buildings is being improved for additional efficiencies – one of the benefits of utilizing the same contractor for each phase of the project. 

Inaugural San Luis Obispo Prescribed Fire Training: Event Brings Diverse Partners Together to Burn and Learn

An inaugural Prescribed Fire Training Exchange, hosted by Swanton Pacific Ranch's Fuels and Vegetation Education program, kicked off this week in San Luis Obispo County. The program, funded by CALFIRE's Healthy Forest Initiative and the California Climate Initiative, incorporates eight days of training — inside the classroom and at two prescribed burns. The Prescribed Fire Training Exchange (TREX) brings together diverse groups of participants, allowing attendees to gain prescribed fire training and hands-on burning experience. TREX also develops key relationships and networks, with the goal of helping to expand the use of prescribed fire in California's Central Coast region.

Cal Poly Receives \$8 Million in Federal Grants

Cal Poly's School of Education has received two highly competitive grants, totaling more than \$8 million, from the U.S. Department of Education to help address a variety of critical issues and areas of need in education.
